


## Does "Moving-To-Work" mean that I have to work???

- Designed for individuals and families who want to get help paying their rent so that they can focus on other areas of their life
  - Education
  - Citizenship/immigration status
  - Promotional opportunities and career advancement
- Not limited to "working" age or "able-bodied" households
- Citizenship/Immigration specifications
- Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) Coordinator is assigned to each household
- Five Year Time-Limited Program

- Hardship Exemption if eligible (62+ year old and/or disabled members)



## **Department of Housing Mainstream Vouchers**

The Housing Authority of the County of San Mateo in 2018 were awarded Mainstream Housing Vouchers (similar to Section 8) targeting disabled adults <u>under</u> 62 years of age.

BHRS was one of six organizations that could refer for the Mainstream Voucher Program

**Eligibility:** 

□ The household meets HACSM Voucher Program requirements such as income, assets, citizenship/immigration, criminal background, etc.

□ The qualifying person must be at least 18 yrs old and under 62 years of age at the time of move in

The qualifying person has a disability as defined by HUD (physical, developmental, chronic health, HIV/AIDS, SMI) \*Disability form has to be signed by MD not an NP

AND at least one (1)

Homeless-Letter of support is required

At risk of being homeless (i.e. 14 days from being homeless) Letter of support is required

□Transitioning out of institutional or other segregated setting

□At serious risk of institutionalization

RECOVERY RESIDENCES AND SOBER LIVING ENVIRONMENTS (SLE)

# RECOVERY RESIDENCES

Also known as Sober Living Environments (SLE) are a safe, clean, sober, residential environment for individuals who have completed or are currently enrolled in Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment and are committed to sobriety that promotes individual recovery through positive peer group interactions among house members and staff.

Sober living housing is affordable, alcohol and drug free and allows the residents to continue to develop their individual recovery plan and to become self-supporting.

# SUPPORTING THE ROAD TO RECOVERY

#### GENERALLY, THESE RESIDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN INTENSIVE OR OUTPATIENT TREATMENT WHILE LIVING IN A RECOVERY RESIDENCE.

Residents who complete treatment may remain in the Recovery Residence but will be expected to pay their fair share of rent.



# **EXPECTATIONS OF RESIDENTS**

- Willing to remain clean and sober
- Must be workign and/or enrolled in a vocatoinal or other training program while living in the program
- Participate in an intensive outpatient or outpatient program while living in the homes
- Attendance at weekly house meetings and 12-step meetings

- Motivated to make positive changes in ones life
- Willing to follow the guidelines of the program
- Must be 18 years or older
- Qualifies as low income
- Priority is given to gradutes of the agency providing the residence

# **OUR COMMON GROUND**

#### MEN AND CO-ED HOUSING SERVICES AVAILABLE

Our Common Ground (OCG) has been providing client centered, dual diagnosis treatment and supportive housing since 1988.

Their men-only and co-ed recovery residences accept clients who are actively engaged in a San Mateo County based outpatient substance abuse treatment program. There is no cost for these services if the person is actively participating in treatment.

# **SERVICE LEAGUE**


### **WOMEN'S HOUSING SERVICES AVAILABLE**

Service League operates five, six-bed homes located in residential settings throughout Redwood City.

These homes are substance free and provide residents the opportunity to get back on their feet while they work towards their goals. Women with children >1 old are accepted.

Residents are required to be working or enrolled in a vocational training program.


# **PROJECT 90**


#### **MEN'S HOUSING SERVICES**

Residents must be enrolled in a DHCS-certified outpatient program and contribute to housing costs based on their ability to pay.

## HOUSING AND RECOVERY SERVICES

Beneficiaries can receive on-going support after treatment, through individual and group counseling, relapse prevention, recovery monitoring or linkage to support groups to assist their recovery.

Recovery services include weekly or monthly recovery coaching, monitoring via telephone, telehealth or in-person meetings, peer-to-peer services, relapse prevention services, linkages to life skills, housing, transportation, selfhelp, spiritual, job training, education services, and family support.






### **Occupational Profile**

"The occupational profile is a summary of the client's occupational history and experiences, patterns of daily living, interests, values and needs (AOTA, 2014, p. S13). The information is obtained from the client's perspective through formal interview and casual conversation and leads to an individualized, client centered approach to intervention.


